DEFINITIONS

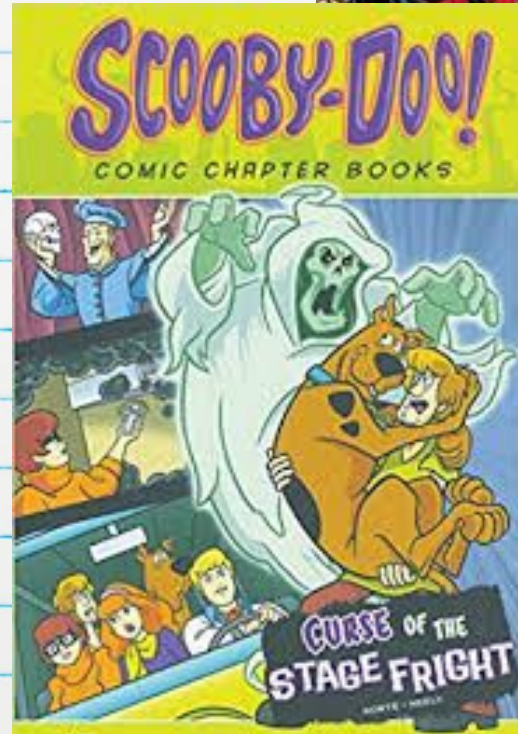
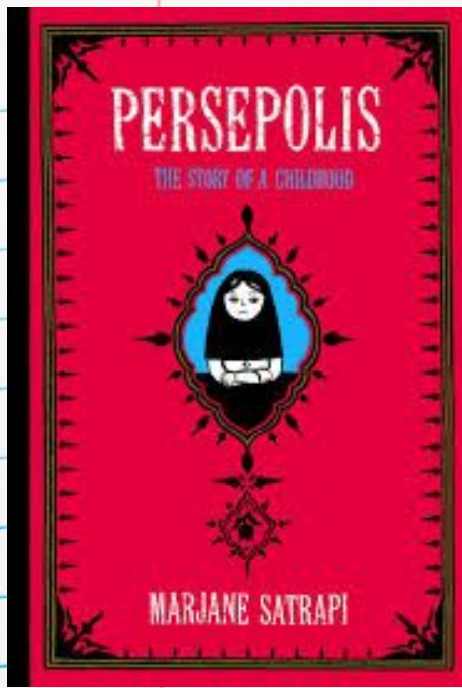
Comic Books- a magazine that presents a serialized story in the form of a comic strip, typically featuring the adventures of a superhero.

Graphic Novels- a novel in comic-strip format.

Experimental Works- work—usually fiction or poetry—that emphasizes innovation, most especially in technique.

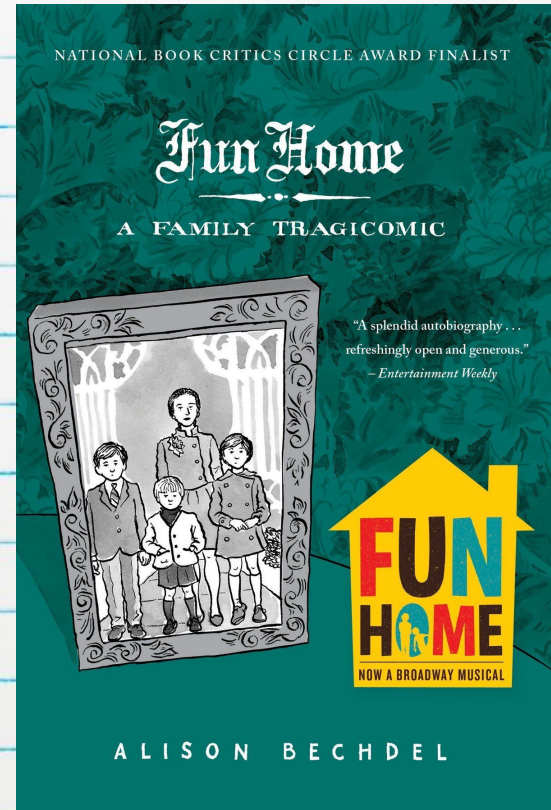

The book addresses themes of sexual orientation, gender roles, suicide, emotional abuse, dysfunctional family life, and the role of literature in understanding oneself and one's family.



OUR QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Question Answers 1 and 2

What's The Story About?

The story details an excerpt from her life after her father has died. It takes us through journey of the moments she spent with her father, as well as her mother's current reaction to his death. Finally revealing, the protagonist's guilt about revealing her sexuality her parents, believing its contributed to her father's death.

What's The Story The Piece Is Telling?

A young woman's mother is giving away her deceased father's books. Many works he spent his time escaping into and admiring. The woman's mother is plagued with mania, and in turn looks to catastrophic works. Similarly, she believes her father used books as escapism, highlighting the importance of Gatsby's tragic social life and its contribution to her father escapism. I believe the story is about the woman's inability to escape herself, as she continues to blame herself for the death of her father, creating a mental prison.

Question Answers 3 and 4

What emotions are covered in this piece?
