# Characteristics of Fiction (very cool)



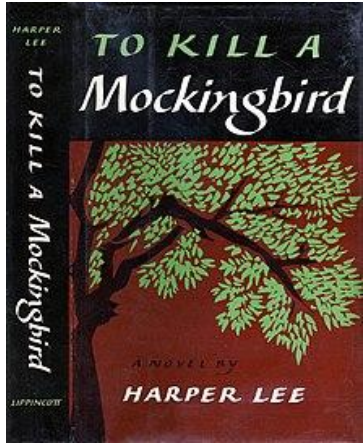
- Usually has two or more characters and results in the protagonist going through some kind of growth or change.
- Can be any length
- Experiencing the scene with the character
- The story is fabricated by the author, but may have true elements or be based upon real life experiences
- Includes messages/themes for the reader to pick up on

# Types of Fiction

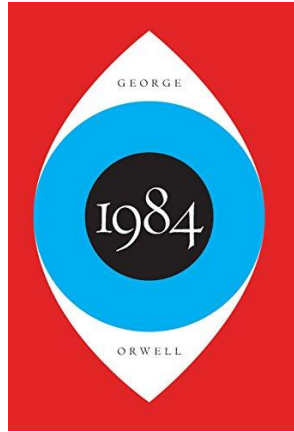
- Realistic fiction
  - Fiction wherein the story is fabricated, but still includes story elements that could occur in the real world
- Science fiction
  - Fiction including futuristic scientific or technological elements and often portray other planets and universes. If technology or science is not included, sometimes books including oppressive government or dystopian futures can be considered science fiction
- Fantasy
  - Fiction portraying unrealistic settings, concepts based on mythology, mythological beings, faeries, mythical creatures, alternate worlds, etc.
- Romance
  - Any other fiction type with an added romantic storyline or major plot including romance of some type
- Thriller
  - Forms parts of mystery and horror. Thrillers include lots of suspense and make the reader feel anxious
- Mystery
  - A story including thriller elements, the main part of it includes a mystery and the process of solving it
- Horror
  - Fiction containing thriller elements as well, often meant to scare the reader
- The list of subgenres could go on forever... those listed represent the most common ones

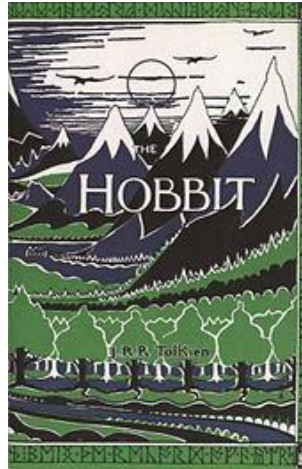
Some Examples of fiction writing in all of the subgenres previously listed



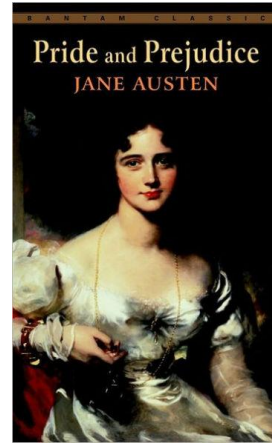

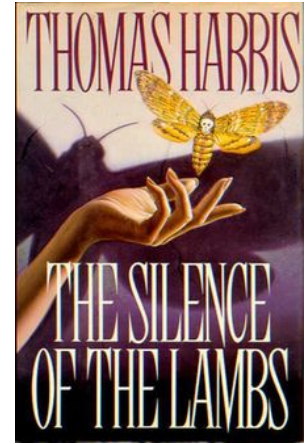
